## Locality Planning Partnership follow up – South Ayrshire Community Transport

- J Reid from SACT was kind enough to come along to our meeting to talk about the services that SACT offer
- Services included mini-bus hire from £36 for up to 20 miles and then following charges for each mile thereafter
- He noted that we would be able to hire a bus and then drive it ourselves or for an additional charge they can send a driver
- Please take notice that THIS IS NOT a replacement for the bus services that run in the village due to the licence that they operate on the back of
  - Unfortunately this is not a solution for the frequent buses that do not turn up due to it not being financially viable as we do not get notice of when the buses are not going to turn up





- He told us that they offer small bus trips all across Scotland at reasonable prices where they will pick you up at the door, these trips are for all ages.
- He gave lots of information to the Planning & Licencing Officer including leaflets and offered to have a smaller meeting with any members of the committee that would like more information

# Weekly Community Club

- R Dalrymple has offered to help start a weekly club where he can tutor Higher and Adv. Higher Maths and Physics
  - It was noted that the TCC thought that this was a brilliant idea and would benefit lots of students in the community
- It was agreed that this would be on a voluntary basis
- He had invisioned a place where people could come to explore new hobbies and learn new skills that may include
  - Introduction to Computing
  - o Arts & Crafts
  - o Chess Club
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Any other clubs that we can get volunteers to run
- At the moment, Scottish law says that all volunteers are not required to be PVG'd so that wouldn't be a problem but all volunteers working near children will need to have a PVG when the law changes at some point next year
  - Subsequently, we are working with Volunteer Scotland Disclosure Services to start the process of joining the PVG scheme free of charge
  - As a result of this, at the meeting we also adopted the following new policies
    - Safeguarding Children Policy (POL-2023-SCP)
    - Safeguarding Adults Policy (POL-2023-SAP)
    - Whistleblowing Policy (POL-2023-WP)
    - Behavioural Code (Members and Volunteers) (POL-2023-BCMV)
    - Behavioural Code (Children and Young People) (POL-2023-BCCYP)
    - Bullying Policy (POL-2023-BP)
    - Accidents and Near Misses Policy (POL-2023-ANM)
  - Any of these policies can be accessed by contacting <u>safeguarding@tarboltoncc.co.uk</u>
- Laura (Librarian) was hoping to start a movie club in the village, when it was spoke to her we agreed that this would be the ideal project to incorporate it into so the idea was that once a month there would be 2 movies on, one for young kids and one for older people
  - She has discussed with other communities that offer this and they advised that as long as people weren't charged for this then it would be alright to play movies from DVD's and services such as Netflix and wouldn't need a license to play them
    - Donations are acceptable
- Any funds required for this can be gained from The Robertson Trust's "Wee Grants" scheme which is ongoing and we can apply for up to £2,000
- This would be a brilliant opportunity for people aged under 24 to run an activity which can be counted as Saltire Award hours and added to UCAS applications for College and Uni
- Lorraine McKenzie has been asked about Hall Rental





- Since the meeting we have been advised we can apply for a discretion to let charges.
- SAC has been asked if they have any laptops that were going out of service as they are well known for donating these to community groups. Ayrshire College has also been asked. Any donations or advise can be sent to <u>social@tarboltoncc.co.uk</u>
- Member of the public are encouraged to come forward with any ideas that they may have so that any materials required for can be accounted for in the funding bid.
